Indicators for School Success - What to Look For

· Self-care and motor skills

- Uses small manipulatives (crayons, paintbrush, buttons, zippers, etc.)
- Has general coordination on playground (kicking balls, running, climbing)
- Performs basic self-help tasks (toileting, eating, washing)

Self-regulation

- Works and plays cooperatively with peers (takes turns/shares)
- Controls impulses and self-regulation (is not disruptive of others)
- Stays focused/pays attention during activities
- Follows one and two step directions
- o Participates successfully in group time (listens, focuses, sits still, participates)

Social expression

- Relates appropriately to adults, other than parent/caregiver
- Appropriately expresses needs and wants verbally in primary language
- o Expresses curiosity and eagerness for learning (tries new activities, asks questions)
- o Has expressive abilities (tells about a story or experience)
- o Engages in symbolic/imaginative play with self or peers (plays house/fireman)

Kindergarten academics

- o Recognizes some letters of the alphabet (may be capitals, lowercase, or combination)
- Writes or attempts to write own name
- Engages with books (knows where to start, associates print with storyline, pretends to read)
- Counts objects
- Recognizes primary colors and shapes




First **STEPS**



Starting School







- → The only eligibility requirement to enter Kindergarten is to be 5 years old on or before <u>September 1st</u>
- → Kindergarten Orientations and assessments are not used to exclude a child
- → Research supports that kids learn best with their same age peers
- → Children's development at this age varies
- → We will work with your child where they are and move them forward!

AGE REQUIREMENTS

IUSD enrolls students where they are age eligible

SCHOOL YEAR	PRE-K/TK	KINDERGARTEN	1ST GRADE
2022-23	5th birthday between September 2nd and February 2nd	5th birthday on or before September 1st	6th birthday on or before September 1st
2023-24	5th birthday between September 2nd and April 2nd		
2024-25	5th birthday between September 2nd and June 2nd		
2024-25	4th birthday by September 11nd		

Can my child participate in Kindergarten if his/her birthday is after the eligibility cut-off? (after September 1st)

IUSD does not have Board Policy that allows our District to enroll children who turn five years old after the September 1st cut-off.



RALPHS COMMUNITY CONTRIBUTION PROGRAM supports 6th Grade Outdoor Science Program

Did you know that by shopping at Ralphs, you, your family members, and friends can support <u>your student's 6th Grade Outdoor Education costs</u>? When you register as a participant in the Ralphs Community Contributions Program, a percentage of every dollar you spend at Ralphs will come back to Greentree on a quarterly basis. We deposit this money into a special account to help support your child's 6th Grade Outdoor Science Education. With strong and continued support of this program, we are able to consistently keep the cost of Outdoor Science Program under \$300 per student.

•Register / Re-Register every school year in August under the Community Rewards section of <u>www.Ralphs.com</u> and name Greentree Elementary School as the receiving school. Family members and friends may also contribute to your child's fund by shopping at Ralphs. They will also need to register, name Greentree as the school to support, and provide our office with quarterly statements, writing the student's name they wish to credit.

•Every quarter, print-out your contribution amount and bring it to the school office. Make sure your student(s) names are written on the statement. This is the only way the school knows how much to credit your child towards their 6th grade Outdoor Education. Without this quarterly statement information, your contribution will go into the general fund for Outdoor Education.

How to Enroll and Re-Register Each Year

- Ask for a Shopper's Card at Ralphs, if you don't have one.
- Create an account at <u>www.ralphs.com</u> and link your Ralphs Shopper's Card in the Ralphs Community Contribution Program. Once you link your Card to Greentree Elementary, all you have to do is shop at Ralphs and swipe your Shoppers Card.
- Re-Register every August and name Greentree as the receiving school.
- Print Quarterly Statement from online and bring it to the school office EACH QUARTER write the name of your student(s) on the statement. THIS IS THE ONLY WAY the school will know how much to credit your student. We have been told by parents that Ralphs no longer lets you see previous statements, and they will not provide this information to you, so it is important that you print your contribution statement each quarter. The school cannot do this for you, due to privacy laws.

Ralphs sends a check to our school on a quarterly basis dependent upon household purchases: Up to \$200 = 1% *** Between \$200.01 and \$350 = 2% *** Between \$350.01 and \$500 = 3% *** Over \$500 = 4%


Irvine Unified School District Time to Enroll

- Step 2: Assemble the Required Documents in a digital format and upload them during online enrollment:
 - * Residency Verification plus two proofs of residency
 - * Verification of Age
 - * Health Conditions Form
 - * Immunization Records

Meet and Greets Monday, August 14, 2023





- → After you have completed enrollment and submitted all of the required documentation to Ms. Cat, she will be scheduling your child for a Meet and Greet
- → This time is used to gather information about a child's overall development
- → Meet and greets include opportunities for students to interact in a small group with other peers and 1:1 with a teacher
- → Data collected is used to balance classes.





- → When completed, classes will be formed and you will receive a letter in the US Mail informing you of Early Eagle/Late Eagle placement for your child.
- → If you are unable to make a Meet & Greet time, your child may be moved to another classroom/time in order to ensure balanced classes. This would happen during the first two weeks of school.
